

and nationally, he said

Recently, an interfaith

clergy colleague asked

with a sense of awe and respect, "You in the Jewish community take care of each other." Yes, we have always taken care of one another. From biblical times to today our community has always felt responsible one for the other.

This tradition is in our DNA.

In our own Temple community we experience this commitment. Just stand in our new lobby and watch as people walk in for the first time. It is wonderful to see the expressions of surprise and awe on their faces. It is even better to see our community, friends, and visitors gather together for learning, worship, and support throughout our building.

Back in 2014 we had a vision of remodeling our education wing to make it accessible for all people no matter their physical needs. This plan to make this vision a reality was priced at \$15 million.

But then our Board of Directors had the foresight and courage to dream bigger, and the vision was expanded to include a dedicated wing for our Early Childhood Center, enhanced community gathering spaces, and a beautiful new lobby. The combination of these building additions, infrastructure investments, development of a new education program and an increased endowment, brought the final L'Dor Vador Campaign goal to \$25.6 million.

Amazingly, through the overwhelming generosity of our congregation, we exceeded that goal by \$540,000. These funds allowed the Board to add back projects that had been canceled due to cost constraints: renovating the bathrooms outside the sanctuary, and upgrading the classrooms in the original Temple building to match those in the new education wing.

Many of you decided to do even more—to include Temple in your wills and estate plans. With all of our congregation's generosity, we celebrated \$32 million raised in the L'Dor Vador Campaign. Some \$26.1 million was raised for use at Temple today, and another \$5.8 million in deferred legacy pledges will go into the Temple endowment to support the congregation in perpetuity.

Nevertheless, there is always more to be done. Many people have asked why we didn't remodel the kitchen, or upgrade Camp TEKO and the Memorial Park. The simple answer is that we could not do everything—renovation and construction are expensive, and all of these projects combined added up to \$80 million—a goal too lofty for us to reach all at once.

However, if we were a community that tackled projects and then said, "We are done," we would not be one of the country's most successful congregations. In the midst of the campaign, generous donors came forward to specifically support TEKO, the kitchen and Memorial Park, and we will begin some targeted projects at each of these sites in the near future. Meanwhile, the Board of Directors is again looking forward, launching a new two-year process of strategic visioning and planning.

For now, we want to express our gratitude to all who made it possible for us to complete this first project. Shavuot is a holiday of gratitude, at which we celebrate the moment when God gave the Torah to the Israelites. Later, once we were established in the Promised Land, Shavuot was the time when Jews brought the first fruits of their harvest to the Temple to show their gratitude to God. In this tradition, I want to extend my gratitude for all this community has accomplished.

Thank you, thank you, for bringing the fruits of your labor to Temple Israel as you continue the tradition bequeathed to us so long ago in the Torah.

#### Dear Friends.

Joining us here at Temple over Memorial Day Weekend and for our Tikkun Leil Shavuot, as our Scholar-in-Residence will be Dr. Daniel Matt, one of the world's leading authorities on Kabbalah and the Zohar, the great book of Jewish Mysticism. Danny has just completed an 18-year project of translating and annotating a comprehensive English translation of the Zohar, opening up its magical world to millions of potential readers. He is also the author of The Essential Kabbalah and God and the Big Bang.

I believe we may be living in a period of Jewish history that will someday be regarded as one in which Kabbalah emerged once again as a central, vital Jewish area of thought. We are blessed that Dr. Matt will be our teacher here at Temple and I ask, urge, and encourage you to be a part of it, whether you are brand new to Kabbalah and have been curious, or if you are one of the many students who have been exploring mysticism with me over the last several years and want to learn from a true master.

Danny will be speaking on themes addressing Shekhina -The Feminine Half of God; God and the Big Bang - the harmony of Science and Spirituality; Finding God in the Material World, and the "ripening of Torah." He will also be our Torah teacher that Shabbat morning, bringing insights from the Zohar into the study of weekly parshiot.

## Scholar-in-Residence Daniel Matt. PhD

Daniel Matt is one of the world's leading authorities on Kabbalah and the Zohar. He has been featured in Time Magazine and has appeared on National Public Radio and the History Channel. He has published over a dozen books, including The Essential Kabbalah (translated into seven languages), Zohar: Annotated and Explained, and God and the Big

Bang: Discovering Harmony between Science and Spirituality.

Recently Daniel completed an 18-year project of translating and annotating the Zohar. In 2016, Stanford University Press published his ninth volume of The Zohar: Pritzker Edition, concluding the Zohar's main commentary on the Torah. For this work, Daniel has been honored with a National Jewish Book Award and a Koret Jewish Book Award. The Koret award called his translation "a monumental contribution to the history of Jewish thought."

For twenty years, Daniel served as professor at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, California, and has also taught at Stanford University and the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Daniel lives in Berkeley with his wife Hana.

### Mobilize for Affordable Housing in **Your Community**

Wednesday, May 17, 7:00 - 9:00 pm.

The lack of affordable housing is one of the most significant contributors to homelessness. In Minnesota over 600,000 households spend more than 30% of their income on housing. which often doesn't leave them enough money to pay for other necessities like food, medicine, and transportation. There are only 200,000 affordable housing units in the 7-county Twin Cities region and 1,000 of these are lost each year. In addition, 149,000 older households in Minnesota qualify for affordable senior housing but there are only 23,400 senior-only units available.

What can you do about this problem? You can start by attending the Mobilize for Affordable Housing in Your Community program at Adath Jeshurun Congregation on Wednesday, May 17, from 7:00 to 9:00 pm. This educational forum on affordable housing was developed by Adath, JCA (Jewish Community Action), Temple Israel, and other groups. You will hear three keynote presentations that will help you understand the situation around affordable housing in Minnesota and the problem of affordable housing in communities you live in. Then, you will break out into small groups with others from the cities you live in to learn about specific affordable housing issues in those cities, and to discuss what action steps you can take to improve the situation. ### Highlights in Jewish History with Dr. Joseph Goldman

#### Gustav Mahler: Composer, Conductor, Tormented Jew

Born to a peddler in 1860, the second child of fourteen, Mahler grew up in poverty, a Jew who felt "always an intruder, never welcomed." At the age of four he discovered the piano, and he eventually studied music in Vienna. By 1880 he was already a leading interpreter of Wagner, and an accomplished composer in his own right. In 1897 he converted to Catholicism to accept the post of conductor of the Vienna Opera. Vienna was the home of vicious anti-Semitism in the arts and sciences. After 10 years and futile progress, Mahler left in 1907, the same year a young Austrian from the backwaters of Upper Austria arrived-Adolf Hitler. Mahler went on to conduct the Metropolitan Opera and compose some of his finest symphonies in America. We shall look at this amazing, talented man and his legacy to the arts and our history.

One of Temple Israel's primary goals is to cultivate in young people a deep sense of religious, spiritual and cultural identity. To meet this goal, the newly designed JEWL program (Judaic Experiential Whole-Person Learning) was launched this past September. JEWL makes Jewish life meaningful, purposeful and fun! Young people explore the ritual, community, beauty and wisdom of Judaism. Our progressive, projectbased and experiential curriculum grows from our passionate belief in making learning relevant, so our courses explore Judaism through the lens of everyday life and help learners connect more deeply to their Jewish values, identity, and community.

At the three-quarter point in our inaugural year of JEWL, a survey was sent out to all JEWL families, as well as to students in sixth and seventh grades. We were amazed by (and proud of) the high percentage of responses, which speaks volumes about the commitment of our Temple families to our partnership in Jewish education! We are grateful for both the positive responses and the constructive critique we received. We hope this information will give clarity and insight into the data collected from our families.










# 2017 Louis Gainsley Award

## Nancy Jaffee-Shiff & Bob Shiff to receive 2017 Louis Gainsley Distinguished Service Award

In our Temple community, we are blessed with individuals, couples and families whose leadership and commitment touch all of us. Each year the Louis Gainsley Distinguished Service Award recognizes the outstanding volunteer efforts of Temple Israel members who have made a significant impact in the Temple community and the Jewish community at large.

On Friday, June 2, the 2017 Louis Gainsley Distinguished Service Award will be presented to Nancy Jaffee-Shiff and Bob Shiff during the Shabbat Service.

You often wonder what motivates people to do what they do in their lives, why they make the decisions they do or take a particular path. What is it that draws people to a cause, an organization, or a religious community like Temple Israel? It can be for personal gain, political aspirations or professional advancement. But these were the furthest things from the minds of Nancy and Bob when they were approached by Temple Israel to "get involved." Instead, they responded to a simple question asked by a Temple Board member: "Will you help us?" With no idea what was needed or expected, they answered "yes"-and the rest, as they say, is history.

That was 30 years ago. For Nancy, volunteering at Temple meant following in her mother's footsteps, immersing herself in Sisterhood, Kol Isha, Temple's Board, and numerous philanthropic and social programs for Temple. She also contributed in the larger Jewish community by planning, fundraising, and chairing the Sholom Ball. Bob joined the Temple Israel Board and quickly lent his expertise at the insistence of Jim Gainsley and Jules Berezovsky, who knew they could count on him to help improve our properties. Camp TEKO was his first project. He hired an architect and contractors to remodel the camp and add the Pavillion and offices, and guided TEKO's ongoing maintenance. After 11 years on the Board, Bob spent another 11 years as chair of the Properties Committee.

Nancy's ties to Temple Israel began at a very early age. She is the daughter of Roz & Art Jaffee, lifelong members of the congregation. Nancy, along with her siblings and numerous Jaffee cousins, ran through the halls of the Temple building starting in Religious School all the way through Confirmation. Nancy's Confirmation picture hangs on the wall across from

Minda and Joseph Halls, and many of her classmates are friends with whom she is still in contact today. After graduating from Southwest High School in Minneapolis, Nancy went to the University of Colorado and graduated with a degree in psychology.

For Bob, being Jewish was just part of growing up in St. Louis Park. Family dinners at Bubbie's house, going to the Standard Club on Sundays, early years at Sharei Zedek in north Minneapolisfamily was what connected him to

community and identity. Bob went to the University of Minnesota, graduating with a degree in Economics. You would never guess this successful property manager, for his first job out of college, operated a jack-hammer and drove a dump truck on a highway reconstruction project! His resume is full of company names that are familiar in the Twin Cities: Health Partners, Target, United Properties and the University of Minnesota McNamara Alumni Center. Bob says he's really "retired" now, but managing a fraternity house on the U of M campus hardly constitutes relaxing!

In 1981 Bob was welcomed into the Jaffee family fold when they were married by Rabbi Shapiro in the Temple sanctuary. Their family ties at Temple deepened in 1983 when their son Dannon was born, and then deepened further when their daughter Sari was born three years later. Soon after, Bob's parents became members at Temple to be with them all. Nancy and Bob's children have grown up with that same Jewish feeling of family and community. Both Dannon and Sari had B'nai Mitzvah ceremonies in our sanctuary, and were confirmed here, too.

Nancy and Bob have raised children and grandchildren who continue the example of volunteering and service. For example, Dannon has raised thousands of dollars through Team Nancy, named in honor of his mother, in the annual MS Walk. Nancy and Bob want their kids to appreciate people and have good hearts. We don't think they have anything to worry about!

Nancy and Bob's generosity and commitment live on in the grounds of TEKO, the stones at our Memorial Park, the houses along Emerson Avenue and in the walls of Temple Israel. Thank you, Nancy and Bob, for saying "yes" all those years.

## **Daily Service Prayer Booklet** Now in Braille Version

Temple is happy to share that our Daily Service Prayer Booklet, Prayers of the Heart, is now available in a braille version. With the assistance of Jill Binder, Temple Israel Past President, we found an organization willing to translate the booklet from English to brailleat no cost to us!

The Hadley Institute for the Blind and Visually Impaired, based in Illinois, was eager to provide the braille edition. The mission of the Hadley Institute is to "promote independent living through lifelong, distance education programs for individuals who are blind or visually impaired, their families, and blindness service providers." Founded in 1920, Hadley offers courses free of charge to its students and their families. It is the largest educator of braille worldwide.

In the late 1960s and early 1970s, Temple Israel Sisterhood members Joan Binder, Doris Sherman, and Eva Tankel pioneered Temple's use of braille in an effort to make worship and community gathering truly accessible by volunteering to make braille translations of many way-finding signs throughout the Temple building. Today, both the Sisterhood Gift Shop and the Bride's Room signs include braille.

We are truly fortunate to receive the gift of this translation of our prayer booklet.
