CLERGY VOICE

Dear Friends,

“The great shofar is sounded; a still, small voice is heard.”

When we first recite these words on Rosh HaShanah during the Unetaneh Tokef prayer, we will notice that Rosh HaShanah falls on Shabbat this year. It is as though amidst the great shofar of the High Holy Days, we are invited to hear the still, small voice of Shabbat. In fact, we are setting a theme for all of 5784—Shabbat Invitation: A Year of Welcoming Shabbat into our Lives. You can learn more about how this theme will weave throughout the year on pages 12-13.

Traditionally, when Rosh HaShanah falls on Shabbat, there are a few changes to the liturgy. We add familiar Shabbat songs like V'Shamru and add a reference to Shabbat every time Yom Tov is mentioned in the candle-lighting prayers and throughout the services. The biggest difference is that traditional synagogues do not even sound the shofar on Rosh HaShanah when it coincides with Shabbat. This prohibition is not centered around the actual sounding or hearing of the shofar blasts, but rather it is an extra precaution against someone carrying the shofar to synagogue on Shabbat.

We know there is great power in hearing the shofar on Rosh HaShanah. The Tekiah Gedolah—the longest blast—is a moment the entire congregation in the sanctuary holds their breath, even erupting in spontaneous applause at a long and powerful blast. The Ba'al Tekiah, the one who sounds the shofar, practices all year for that one moment. At Temple Israel, we will sound the shofar on Shabbat, in keeping with our Reform tradition.

Yet, we also recognize the great power in silencing the shofar on Shabbat. This year, we will take a pause amidst the shofar blasts to hear the silence, rather than the sounds. This selective silencing of the shofar can help us pay attention to what we want to amplify in our lives, and where we need to turn the volume down.

As a community, I want to amplify the voices in our sanctuary, beginning on Rosh HaShanah. Yes, you could turn on Zoom and pray from your living room. However, we miss your voices in our sanctuary as we sing Avinu Malkeinu. We continue to create a safe and welcoming sanctuary for all who can choose to attend in person.


We also want to invite in Shabbat practices that are contemplative and calming. Consider turning off your devices for 24 hours, or beginning with half a day and seeing how it goes. Make an intentional choice about how you will begin Shabbat—with a prayer, a moment of meditation, or a phone call to a loved one. Join us for Shabbat services—we are here every Friday at 6:00 p.m. You can count on that.

Light Shabbat candles, reflecting on the highlights and hurdles of the past week. Entering Shabbat allows us to gain some separation from the lowlights of the past week, reinvigorating our spirit with the energy to embrace hopes and dreams for the coming week. Judaism divides our year into weekly bite-sized new beginnings.

So often I hear people bemoaning how hard life has become; our world feels in disarray and we are overwhelmed. All this might be true, but strengthening ourselves one week at a time keeps us in the present and allows us to meet our challenges head-on with resilience and courage. Our sages were so wise.

Shabbat is just one of Judaism's healing remedies for our ever-changing world. I promise you will gain insight and understanding over a year's time. Join us.

Music During the High Holy Days

For decades, Temple's organ has been part of our High Holy Days musical experience. Unfortunately, despite regular maintenance, our organ has aged to the point that it cannot be repaired. We look forward to sharing beautiful music with you this year, featuring our outstanding pianist, Jayson Rodovsky, our cellist, Janet Horvath, and our other talented instrumentalists; our High Holy Days Choir, and, of course, Cantor Sharett-Singer and Alex Bonoff.

TASHLICH

The ritual of Tashlich—casting away while reciting prayers for forgiveness—customarily occurs Rosh HaShanah afternoon (but can also happen any time before Yom Kippur) near a moving body of water. Simply praying at the water, a symbol of cleansing, is said to be auspicious. Some choose to throw stones into the water symbolizing the casting away of sins for the new year.

Here are Tashlich rituals you may use on your own or with others. After the ritual, adults and youth might enjoy writing a letter to themselves which they can read in six months, or next Rosh HaShanah.

Begin by reading in Hebrew and/or English:

Who is like you, O God, forgiving iniquity and pardoning the transgressions of the remnant of Your people! You do not retain Your anger forever, for You delight in steadfast love. You will again have compassion upon us, subduing our iniquities; You will cast all their sins into the depths of the sea.

[Micah 7:18, 19, Aigen trans.]

Sing or read together:

Read together:

Let us cast away the sins of times we did not reach out to help others. Let us cast away sins of not being better allies because of our own privileges. Let us cast away the sins of times we did not help our siblings and community members. Let us cast away the sins of the times we did not have the courage to speak up about injustice. Let us cast away the sins of times that we did not help others because we were happy with our own lives.

Let us cast away the times we witnessed prejudice or discrimination but did nothing. Let us cast away the sin of ignoring those in need. Let us cast away the sins of not having time to be part of activism in our communities. Let us cast away the sins of not giving tzedakah to causes. Let us cast away the sin of complacency in oppression.

Anyone may share something out loud that that would like to “cast away” in the new year, and then everyone may take a few minutes to quietly approach the water where they may gently throw stones into the water.

Another option is writing down regrets on small slips of paper with non-permanent magic markers. Families have an opportunity to “wash away” regrets from the past by dropping them into a pan of warm, soapy water and watching the ink dissipate.

YIZKOR: REMEMBERING THOSE WHO HAVE DIED

Our Book of Remembrance is one way that we at Temple Israel honor the tradition of giving tzedakah during Yizkor. We inscribe the names of our friends and family whom we wish to remember. This year, our Book of Remembrance will be available online for our entire congregation. Consider honoring those who have died with contributions of \$36 or more for each name listed in our Book of Remembrance. In addition to listing the names of loved ones, the book includes a separate section devoted to family members who lost their lives in the Holocaust.

Memorial plaques are a permanent way to honor the passing of a loved one. Each year during the week of their yahrzeit this plaque will be displayed in the chapel. A donation of \$600 will provide the plaque, and supports Temple's endowment. A dedication of these plaques will take place during the Yizkor service on Yom Kippur afternoon. In addition, a small brass plate will be permanently hung in the hallway to the sanctuary.

For nearly 60 years, our current site on Lake Minnetonka has been a place that has sparked countless lifelong friendships, a place for learning and growth, a place for Jewish identity to thrive. Unfortunately, decades of activity (and Minnesota winters) have taken their toll on TEKO. We began a \$12.8M capital campaign to create new spaces, renovate old ones, and bring green energy to this special place.

Now that the current phase of construction is nearly complete, we invite you to share in our joy, pride, and excitement by joining in the community grand opening of Camp TEKO on Sunday, October 1.

The grand opening will feature family-friendly fun and games, festive food, and tours of the new Discovery Center, Welcome Center, Chapel, Boathouse, and more.

You will also have a chance to learn about TEKO's green spaces, including solar panels, 10 miles of underground piping for geothermal heating and cooling, and special gardens that collect runoff and clean the water before it flows back into Lake Minnetonka.

Using Jewish values as a guide, Temple is engaged in many justice areas. Temple lay leaders have built task forces focused on specific topics. Anti-Semitism - Anti-Semitism has risen sharply over the last few years. We are bringing educational programs on this issue to Temple and actively engaging the wider Twin Cities community in these critical conversations.

Housing Justice - We believe that everyone should have a home. Join us in our advocacy efforts, and attend the Families Moving Forward Housing Celebration on Friday, October 6.

Immigration Justice - In January, Temple Israel began hosting a family in need, living the value of welcoming all. Our current family includes a 40-year-old Angolan woman seeking asylum for herself and her 11-year-old son. Both she and her son are enthusiastically enrolled in school. They are native Portuguese speakers but learning English quickly. Our responsibilities as hosts are varied. We help with collecting items for an apartment, school, transportation, and just learning about the community. There are many opportunities to volunteer.

Reproductive Rights - We are committed to safe reproductive rights for all. Our group is building partnerships with Minnesota organizations helping in this effort.

Sustainability and Climate Action - Temple Israel is setting a goal to become Gold LEED Certified in the coming months, the culmination of a multi-year effort.

The author's two teenage children were killed when a drunk driver hit the family car during an outing, changing the course of the family's life forever.
