How can Judaism be flexible enough to change for the 21st century while still remaining true to the essence of our tradition? This is a central question for any rabbi or clergy today. We in the Reform Movement have been asking this question for 100's of years and will continue to wrestle with its implications for the next 100 years.

In this light, the Minnesota Rabbinical Association (MRA) recently re-evaluated the historic marriage location resolution. Over the past six decades, weddings were performed by MRA rabbis in three exclusive venues: 1) in a synagogue; 2) in a home; 3) outside.

As of May 24, 2012, the MRA changed its wedding location policy to allow the decision about officiating at wedding venues to be at the sole discretion of each rabbi. While we encourage couples to consider the synagogue as the center of upholding the sanctity of the wedding covenant, the clergy of Temple Israel will officiate at venues outside of the synagogue.

We have decided as a clergy team to broaden options for any couple for two major reasons. First, and foremost, we believe that times are changing and couples believe that choices are essential. Second, in 2009 we doubled the number of weddings we performed from 20 a year to over 40 a year. On popular weekends, we can perform multiple wedding ceremonies and meet the ever-growing needs of our congregation.

With the wedding location conversation broadened, the MRA was able to find consensus on a number of other important Jewish values that we mutually agreed upon:

- We require pre-marital counseling.
- Modesty in dress and all aspects of celebration.
- Moderation in choice of decorations and flowers. .
- . Minimization of waste in the celebration and consciousness of impact on the environment.
- . Food that is appropriate to the celebration of a seudat mitzvah (the celebration of the mitzvah of the wedding) as interpreted by our religious traditions.
- Doing tzedakah in order to remember our responsibility to others even as we are celebrating our joyful occasion (e.g., giving to worthy causes that are meaningful to the celebrating family).

More detailed conversations can happen with your officiating clergy.




