RABBI ZIMMERMAN

Dear Friends,

In 2016, a survey found that more than 60 percent of Republicans don't want their children to marry outside their party, and 60 percent of Democrats feel the same way. This fear of inter-political marriages is a new phenomenon—political gridlock has moved from the voting booth to under the chuppah.

This year, for our *Voices: Ideas of Our Time* event at Temple, we are bridging that political divide.

Our co-chairs, Lynne and Andy Redleaf and Marlene Goldenberg and Bobby Patrick VI, are two couples who are in happy inter-political marriages. It was from this perspective of listening to one another that we intentionally chose this year's speakers: Ari Fleischer, the former press secretary to President George W. Bush; and David Axelrod, the former senior adviser to President Barack Obama. Our speakers will discuss and model how to speak with one another when you disagree and represent two different ideologies.

Hearing from individuals who are on the front lines of the issues that confront our world and country today is exactly the purpose of *Voices: Ideas of Our Time*. We want to tackle the world's complexities and hear from those whose actions, writings and lives take on challenges on the front lines. In the past, we have heard from Paul Rusesabagina, the real Hotel Rwanda owner; Maziar Bahari, a journalist imprisoned in Iran; and Mark Kelly, astronaut and author whose work speaks to courage under pressure.

People who have put their lives and reputations on the line to navigate and improve our ever-changing world are the voices that inspire us at Temple Israel. We are driven to retell the lessons learned from their stories, make these ideas known to a wider circle, and take action inspired by our Jewish wisdom.

So many are eager to witness Fleischer and Axelrod tackle tough questions from different sides of the political aisle and find a way to get underneath these questions—not merely finding common ground or agreeing to disagree, but perhaps leaning into their disagreements to find better solutions for our problems today. OK—I'm a rabbi—I believe in miracles!

Come join us on Tuesday, May 15 for this year's *Voices: Ideas of Our Time*.

# CELEBRATE SHAVUOT

Shavuot is the Hebrew word for weeks and refers to the Jewish festival marking the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai, which occurs seven weeks after Passover. Shavuot, like many other Jewish holidays, began as an ancient agricultural festival that marked the end of the spring barley harvest and the beginning of the summer wheat harvest. In ancient times, Shavuot was a pilgrimage festival during which Israelites brought crop offerings to the Temple in Jerusalem. Today, it is a celebration of Torah, education and actively choosing to participate in Jewish life. At Temple Israel, we celebrate the Confirmation of our 10<sup>th</sup> grade students on Shavuot.

## TEMPLE ISRAEL YOUTH MARCH FOR THEIR BELIEFS

Leviticus teaches us, “Do not stand idly by while your neighbor’s blood is shed.” Our students are heeding this lesson as they stand up against gun violence.

Temple Israel youth member Miya Latz was one of more than 70 Jewish youth from the Twin Cities who traveled to Washington, D.C. to participate in March for Our Lives on March 24. Billie Forester, a member of Students Demand Action: End Gun Violence in America, helped organize the satellite anti-gun violence rally in St. Paul at the State Capitol.

Both Billie and Miya see their Jewish education at Temple Israel as an important foundation for their involvement in the movement. “Our Jewish traditions tell us not to be passive if we see a problem—to think critically, to be well-read and to understand the issues. Social justice and activism begins with asking questions and being engaged,” Billie said.

“Growing up in the Jewish community and Temple Israel greatly influenced my decision to become involved,” Miya said. “Parents, teachers and lessons from Torah have all shaped who I am today. And knowing that Jews were killed by guns in the past made me particularly sympathetic with the cause.”

We are very proud of Miya and Billie and all Temple Israel youth who are standing up for their beliefs. The prophet Joel teaches us that the old shall dream dreams and the youth shall see visions. We are honored to be a part of the youth bringing their visions to reality.

## **Micki Naiman: TOUCHING LIVES, BUILDING JEWISH COMMUNITY**

Temple Israel member and community volunteer extraordinaire Micki Naiman is someone who immediately welcomes you into her universe of friends. Vivacious and genuine, Micki's generous and loving spirit has rippled out to touch the lives of many here at Temple and the broader Jewish community for more than five decades.

Born in Germany to parents of Holocaust survivors, Micki and her family arrived in Minneapolis from Sweden with only a few suitcases, their possessions lost in a ship that sank in the North Sea. Although she grew up with Jewish families (many of whom are Temple members and are among her circle of friends today), Micki's parents did not belong to a synagogue and chose not to practice their religion. "It was not until I went to Herzl Camp on a scholarship in the fifth grade that my Jewish spirit was ignited. I connected with my Judaism through ritual, including Shabbat. It all made sense in my 10-year-old mind," Micki said.

"My Jewish awakening began at summer camp but my re-awakening occurred at Temple Israel. I joined as a young bride in the 1960s and my sons went through the education programs and Confirmation. Two of my grandchildren had their B'nai Mitzvah at Temple and have attended Camp TEKO with two

grandkids still to come," Micki said.

Micki has served on Temple Israel's Board of Directors and Sisterhood among numerous other committees and volunteer positions. "What I feel I brought to this work is fairness, insight and an ability to coalesce ideas," said Micki. She also brought her fun and engaging spirit, performing in Temple's musical revues for many years.

Her presence in and commitment to the Jewish community goes well beyond Temple Israel. Micki's volunteering is near legendary—from Sholom Minneapolis to B'nai B'rith and the Sabes Jewish Community Center—but she always made time for her ever-expanding circle of friends, often inviting people new to the

"The importance of Temple for me grows every year. Recently, I opened up my eyes in the recovery room after having surgery and saw Rabbi Zimmerman smiling down at me. I said, 'It's Friday night—aren't you supposed to be at services?' She said, 'I was at services and now I am here with you.'

"The clergy and our many friends in the congregation have always been there for us. We are so blessed to have Temple Israel at the center of our community and Jewish life."

# Q & A WITH RABBI KLEIN

TEMPLE ISRAEL’S NEW  
DIRECTOR OF LIFELONG LEARNING

## Where did you grow up?

I grew up in Montclair, New Jersey, a suburb of New York known for excellent public schools. The students in my elementary school represented diverse ethnic, racial, religious, and economic backgrounds and experiences. Administrators liked to say it was a microcosm of the world.

## What influenced your decision to become a rabbi?

My childhood Rabbi, Perry Raphael Rank—a Minneapolis native, had a way with kids and families that was kind, engaging and responsive. I loved learning and he was happy to answer questions or ask me more. As a nine-year-old, I even said I wanted to be a rabbi. Halfway through college, I circled every course in the catalog in which I was interested, and soon I was majoring in religion. I found myself drawn to the rabbinate where I could bring together the parts of me that wanted to be a doctor, lawyer, psychologist, teacher and activist.

## With life today so busy and full, why do you think that Jewish lifelong learning is important for people to include in their lives?

The Talmud compares engaging in study to lots of other mitzvot combined, presumably because study leads to action. Whether we are in our tenth month or our tenth decade, formal and informal learning nourishes our minds, empowers us to communicate and to connect with others.

## What excites you about coming to Temple Israel?

A pride in 140 years of history coupled with a clear sense of vision about its future. I feel like I will have a role in something much bigger than myself, than any one person, or any one moment. The people I have met at Temple and the conversations we have had up until now have filled me with excitement.

## What are you looking forward to doing in Minnesota?

I am looking forward to eating at French Meadow (the clergy took me there in November for the first time), Twin Cities Pride, the State Fair, Midtown Greenway, theatre, art, music and the lakes, and yes—even to experiencing, understanding and dare I say *being* “Minnesota nice.”

Mark's career led him to serving Minnesotans through politics, finance, and green energy. Though he is now retired, Mark is no less busy than he was while working! He is currently the treasurer of the Sabes JCC, and he is also involved with the Service Core of Retired Executives (SCORE), where he helps existing businesses with all aspects of their finances.

Even beyond their professional lives, these two have been serving others for decades. When they met 21 years ago, Mark was volunteering at a hospice and Marcy was helping with local B'nai Brith chapters. Mark had grown up at Temple Israel, and Marcy officially joined because Temple reminded her of the synagogue she attended growing up in Omaha, Nebraska. Rabbi Zimmerman officiated at their wedding ceremony in 2006, and as she blessed them, their union blessed Temple and our community.

As they grew within Temple, they started a Chavurah group that expanded over the past decade to celebrate members' weddings, births and other honors. After services on Friday nights, you could see them welcoming friends, making new ones, and sharing a meal together.

It was a High Holy Day message in 2007 that took their involvement at Temple to another level.

During this service, the clergy talked about different aspects of homelessness, asking the congregation to fill out a form after services to express their interest in volunteering. Mark attended the first meeting of one of the initiatives, Families Moving Forward (FMF), and left that meeting as a co-chair of FMF's first event. Marcy soon joined as a chair and together, they spearheaded the hosting of families in need at Temple Israel. The amount of time, assets and manpower it takes to make the program work is incredible. Marcy and Mark purchase all supplies,

schedule volunteers, and handle myriad administrative issues in transforming our classrooms into homes for 3 to 4 families for two weeks twice each year. Their leadership has been vital in growing FMF to become a successful staple of Temple's outreach.

Marcy and Mark's impact can also be seen in many other areas. Marcy started as a member of the Sisterhood board in 2001 and became president in 2005. When her term ended, Marcy took her passion for Women of Reform Judaism to other levels. She joined the WRJ Board of Directors in 2007 and the Midwest District Executive Committee in 2008. Marcy served as Midwest District President from 2012-14 and continued on the WRJ Board until this year. She is also a Temple docent, hosting visiting church and school groups at Shabbat services, and a Daily Worship Service Leader. Mark currently serves as co-president for Men's Club. In addition, he lent his expertise in planning TEKO picnics, Purim Carnivals and Consecration Pancake Breakfasts. He also served on several Temple committees including finance, fundraising and development and outreach. Both Mark and Marcy are members of our Usher Corps.

We are honored to celebrate this dynamic couple and are so lucky they chose Temple Israel when they were looking for a synagogue. We are joyful that the warm and welcoming feeling they felt when they arrived at Temple in those early years is now one they share with many others who come to Temple Israel.

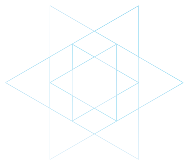
