CLERGY VOICE

Dear Friends,

l am sure it sounds a bit cliché, but one of my favorite new hobbies is watching Fred eat.

I enjoy seeing how his mind works as he decides which blueberry to eat or which piece of toast he wants next. Once he decides, he confidently picks up his food and carefully places it in his mouth. I love observing as he decides it is time to drink water and grabs his sippy cup. It is always an adventure attempting to guess which food he is in the mood for at any given meal – and what will end up on the floor if I am not carefully watching.

It is a privilege for Mike and me to watch Fred's personality emerge – as well as his likes and dislikes – without worry that we might not be able to provide him his next meal. Yet, for many families in our community, this is a daily concern that is all too easy for the rest of us to take for granted.

For the past 25 years, Temple Israel has worked to address this disparity here in Minneapolis. As many of you know, Jefferson Community School, a K-8 public school neighboring Temple in Uptown, is one of the poorest schools in Minnesota – the percentage of students on subsidized lunch plans at Jefferson is staggering. Through reading to these children and working with them one-on-one to hone other skills, many Temple congregants have built relationships with these students and their families. Many of the Jefferson parents are constantly worried about their children's nutrition, especially during breaks from school. This is one of the many reasons why we asked Jefferson school to partner with us for Meals on Wheels.

This is our third year partnering

with Jefferson to ensure that these families have delicious food on their tables come Thanksgiving Day. We are excited for the families from both Jefferson and Temple to again be able to wish one another well during this festive time of giving thanks.

I hope you will join us to package food or deliver meals on Thanksgiving for the 26th annual Stephan Larsen Wolf Meals on Wheels program (read more about Meals on Wheels on page 5). It's a wonderful way to honor Stephan's memory and his passion for social justice while showing gratitude for the blessings in our lives.

Remembering Stephan Larsen Wolf November 22, 1971 - December 23, 1992



Stephan Larsen Wolf was idealistic, motivated and committed to tikkun olam repairing the world. A Temple Israel member from birth, he was guided by Jewish teachings and loved his family, friends, and community. Tragically, he died in a car accident at age 21. Just a month before his

death, he penned these very powerful words in his journal:

"Jewish teachings dictate that one is never really dead unless all but forgotten. My belief, and consequently my advice, is to live forever. Leave your mark! Be remembered as one who has accomplished great things. Ensure that your spirit lives on in the hearts, souls and minds of all those that shall follow." In 1978, the TIPTY (Temple Israel Program for Temple Youth) Meals on Wheels program was started with the help of Jane Ketroser and Sheila Schuman. In 1993, Anne and Allen Wolf chose to honor the memory of their son by establishing the Stephan Larsen Wolf Meals on Wheels Fund at Temple Israel and sponsoring the Thanksgiving Meals on Wheels program in his memory. Today, 400 meals are prepared, packaged and delivered on Thanksgiving morning each year.

"It has been said by many that Stephan would be proud to know about this important project that the congregation is doing, and he would be smiling," said his father, Allen Wolf.
