Dear Friends,

The holidays came late this year. Okay, let's be honest. When do the holidays ever come on time? They are a moving target that never quite lands where we expect them to. This year, the

High Holy Days began in October, which means that we did not end Sukkot until one month before Thanksgiving. By then many of us are already making our Thanksgiving plans. The proximity of these two holidays brings into sharp focus their similarities.

Sukkot is the Jewish harvest festival. It is a time when we build sukkahs in our yards. on our roofs, or on our balconies. It is when we are commanded to dwell in our sukkah. a ritual that brings us close to the elements and reminds us of the abundance God provides. The sukkah's temporary quality, hung with fruits and symbols of the harvest season, reminds us of the precariousness of our existence in the face of the forces of nature. Its roof is thinly covered with branches, admitting sunlight, starlight, wind and rain. Dwelling in it increases our gratitude to God for the blessing of solid roofs over our heads. Sukkot is a season of joy, when we are commanded to be happy as we are grateful for the bounty that the earth has produced.

The Pilgrims, escaping to the new land in pursuit of religious freedom, knew their Bible. Seeing themselves as new Israelites in a new "promised land," the Pilgrims surely found inspiration in the description of Sukkot, where God commands the ancient Israelites to observe the Feast of Booths and to "rejoice before Adonai your God" at the time of the fall harvest. Living in a precarious situation, at the mercy of the land they harvested, the Pilgrims feasted in their new home in order to show gratitude

to their new neighbors and to God. The Pilgrims, who often found themselves without food, took this opportunity to rejoice. They felt blessed to have an opportunity to begin again.

As Jews we have the opportunity to start anew each year as we celebrate our New Year of Rosh HaShanah and atone for our actions of the previous year on Yom Kippur. As Jews we celebrate the earth and all of its abundance on Sukkot. Yet, by dwelling in our temporary sukkahs, we also begin to understand the precarious conditions that the Pilgrims experienced in the 16th century, and more important, that many in our community experience in the 21st. As we carry this new understanding into Thanksgiving, it is my hope that we will not only rejoice in the richness of the earth, but we will also take care of the needs in our community.

As our homes fill with the smells of pumpkin pies baking and turkeys roasting, it is my wish that we will remember those who do not have the luxury of participating in these traditions. I invite you to reach out to the many people who need our help by joining us for the Stephan Larsen Wolf Memorial Meals-on-Wheels Program this year. We will prepare a traditional Thanksgiving meal on the afternoon of Wednesday, November 23, and package and deliver food on Thanksgiving morning. Or, create your own tradition on how to best reach out to the community that so desperately needs us. In this way we will not only "rejoice before Adonai our God," but we will also ensure that others will be able to do the same.

Year End Gifting

Tax advantaged charitable giving strategies

Gifts of Stock, Bonds or Mutual Funds

When you donate appreciated securities directly to Temple Israel, rather than selling them, you avoid federal and state capital gains taxes. To qualify, you must have owned the security for more than a year, and the deduction cannot be more than 30% of your adjusted gross income.

IRA Charitable Distributions

If you are 70½ or older, you and your spouse can make direct payouts from your IRAs of a total of up to \$100,000 per year each to Temple Israel and other charities, without paying tax on the donations. The charitable distributions qualify toward your required minimum distribution. In addition, you won't have extra income that could cost you itemized deductions or personal exemptions, and you won't trigger more tax on your Social Security benefits.

Put Temple Israel in your will, and please let us know.

Gifts may be designated as a percentage of your estate, a specific dollar amount or description of property, residual of your estate, or contingent upon a certain event happening. Estate taxes are reduced by the value of the gift.

Remembering Stephan Larsen Wolf November 22, 1971 - December 23, 1992



Stephan Larsen Wolf was idealistic, motivated and committed to tikkun olam—repairing the world. A Temple Israel member from birth, he was guided by Jewish teachings and loved his family, friends and community. Tragically, he died in a car accident at age 21. Just a month before his death, he penned these very powerful words in his journal:

"Jewish teachings dictate that one is never really dead unless all but forgotten. My belief, and consequently

my advice, is to live forever. Leave your mark! Be remembered as one who has accomplished great things. Ensure that your spirit lives on in the hearts, souls and minds of all those that shall follow."

In 1978, the TIPTY (Temple Israel Program for Temple Youth) Meals-on-Wheels program was started with the help of Jane Ketroser and Sheila Schuman. In 1993, Anne and Allen Wolf chose to honor the memory of their son by establishing the Stephan Larsen Wolf Meals-on-Wheels Fund at Temple Israel and sponsoring the Thanksgiving Meals-on-Wheels program in his memory. Today, 400 meals are prepared, packaged and delivered on Thanksgiving morning.

"It has been said by many that Stephan would be proud to know about this important project that the congregation is doing, and he would be smiling," said his father, Allen Wolf.
