RABBI ZIMMERMAN

Dear Friends,

As I grow older there are moments that make me realize that I have lived through a great deal of change—history that is larger than merely my own life and circumstances. The addition of the new Reform Machzor for the Days of Awe, *Mishkan Hanefesh*, is one of those moments.

I remember the old Union Prayer Book of my childhood, the small black volume stacked on my family’s kitchen table so we would remember to grab them on our way to High Holy Days services. I felt so mature when I was able to carry my own into the

Temple. Then when I was a teenager, the *Gates of Repentance* was introduced at Shaare Emeth. Everyone was abuzz. The synagogue even had extra copies on a shelf in case you forgot yours at home. The book was larger, and even now, years later, its dark red cover brings back to me memories of the sweet smell of the sanctuary ablaze with golden carpet and the murmur of our congregation in prayer.

I love change, and especially change that grows from our beautiful tradition while reflecting our lives today. Changes in our Reform Jewish prayer book over my lifetime have taught me that prayer is an expression of our relationship to God and the world around us. I have come to believe that change, even in our most sacred arena, is exciting. The transition into a new vocabulary of prayer reminds me that speaking to God is a creative, spiritual act.

This High Holy Days 5778 we are introducing once again a new Reform Machzor on Rosh HaShanah. The red cover is replaced with a gold one, and inside the pages are filled with the traditional prayers and beautiful new poetry.

Unlike when I was younger, we no longer expect you to bring your own prayer books to Temple. Through a remarkable gift, made in gratitude by a friend to honor the Hasko and Dveris families, we will have enough copies for each of you waiting in the pews.

As I do every year, I feel the excitement of the High Holy Days approaching, and this season in particular the winds of change are upon us with the new Machzor. In its pages there is waiting for us an invitation to explore the deepest yearnings of our hearts, and to sit in awe of the big questions confronting humanity today. For as 20th century theologian, Holocaust survivor and Reform movement leader Leo Baeck so eloquently said: “All religion is an attempt to express... what is essentially inexpressible.”

RABBI CYTRON JOINS US FOR THE HIGH HOLY DAYS

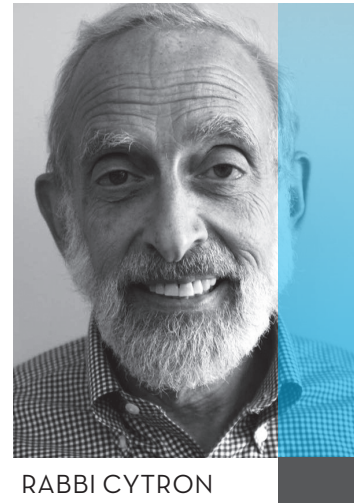
At the High Holy Days this year, we are honored to have Rabbi Barry Cytron join us in leading worship and speaking from the bimah to inspire our congregation.

Rabbi Cytron has been a vital rabbinic presence for our community for nearly 30 years. In 1983, he became senior rabbi at Adath Jeshurun Congregation, and in 1992, he was appointed as the first ever Max Newman Family Chair in Rabbinics. He has taught countless religious studies students at Macalester College, where he was on the faculty beginning in 1989 until he retired this past May. He directed the Jay Phillips Center for Interfaith Learning, a partnership of Saint John's University and the University of St. Thomas, from 1996 until 2008. For the past nine years, he served the Macalester community as Associate Chaplain for Jewish Life, and he continues to serve as Senior Scholar at Adath.

One of his proudest contributions to the Jewish community is the role he has played in inspiring the next generation of rabbis. Seven recent Macalester graduates are now pursuing graduate studies at our country's most notable rabbinical schools, thereby helping to bolster the ranks of Jewish leadership committed to building a bridge of meaning from ancient Jewish texts to our modern world and its coming generations.

He will share his insights with us over these High Holy Days as Rabbi Hartman will be on maternity leave. On your behalf, I personally thank Rabbi Cytron for sharing his wisdom and spirit with the Temple community as we gather as a congregation this September.

We appreciate the feedback many of you offered as we were deciding how Temple might use this Machzor. We truly believe this new prayer book will provide our Temple family with meaning and inspiration that will enrich our Rosh HaShanah experience.

We look forward to exploring the meditations and readings with you, and wish you and your loved ones a Happy and Healthy New Year.

- ▶ All users of the parking lot will park their own cars, greatly easing the flow of traffic in and around the parking lot.

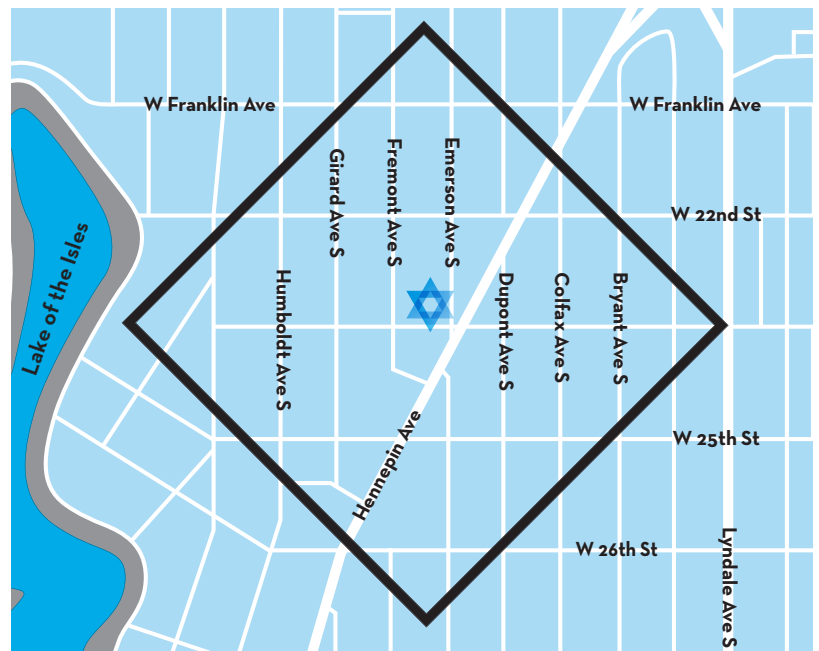
Ride the Free Shuttle Bus

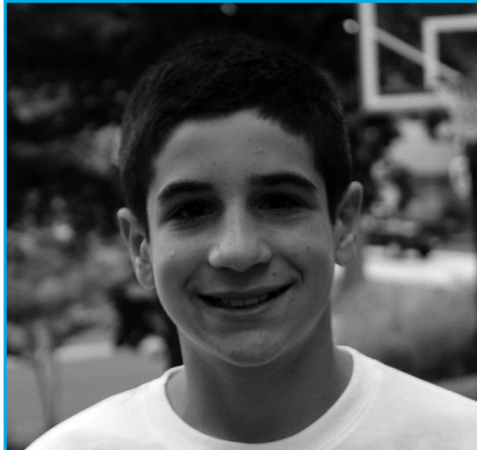

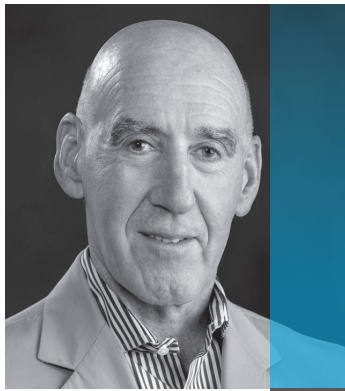

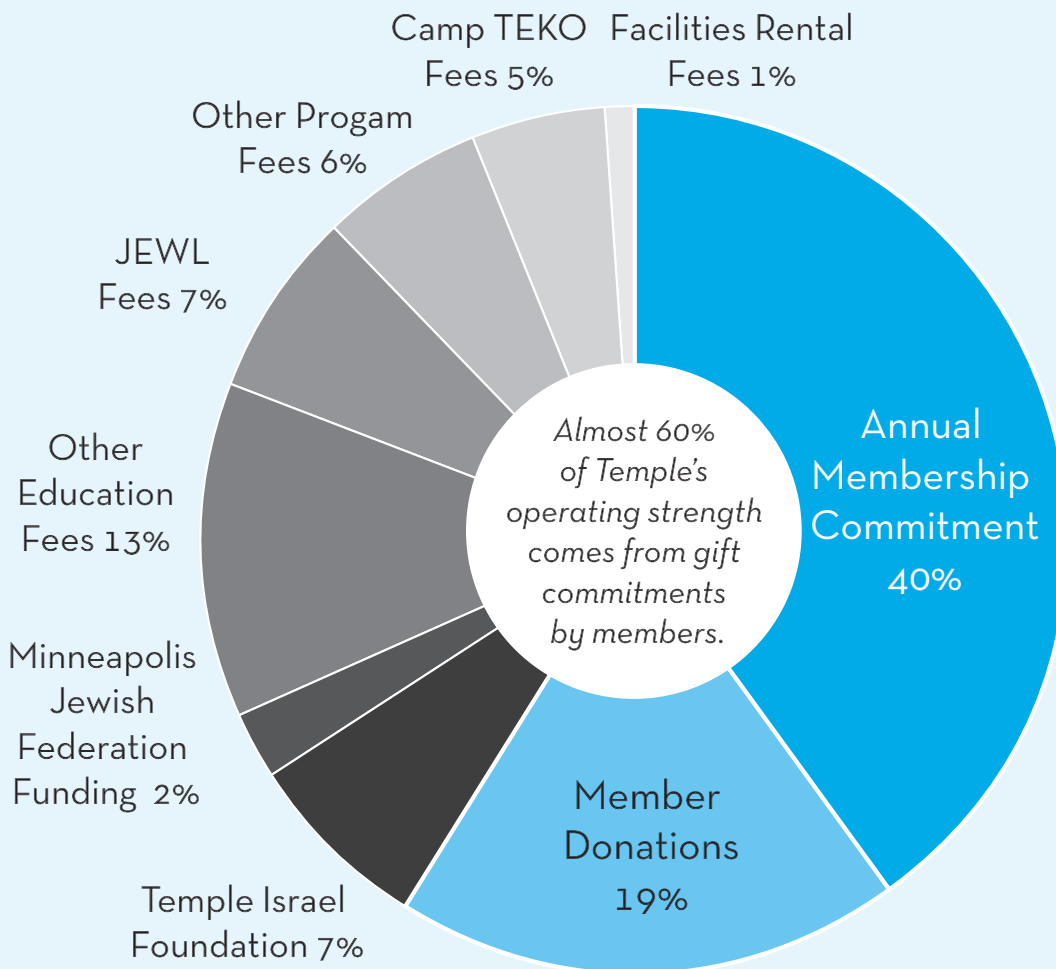
As members, we take care of Temple to take care of each other. Members support Temple through many commitments. Participation by each one of us within the community is our Jewish value—this is what we do.
